Class Leaders

- Serve as a member of the Council's Executive Board.
- Serve as the public face of undergraduate philanthropy within the Brown community.
- Recruit volunteers from each undergraduate class to help with event and marketing efforts. Motivate volunteers throughout the year by leading meetings and communicating via email and text message.
- Develop and execute marketing strategies to educate peers about the impact of philanthropy.
- Lead the planning and execution of at least two philanthropy education events: Giving Tuesday in the fall and Brunonians Pay It Forward Day in the spring.
- Receive recognition as a volunteer leader within the Brown community, including invitations to occasional conference calls with President Paxson.
- If possible, join other volunteers in New York City for the annual Volunteer Summit in Spring 2021.
