### **Faculty:** discovering new knowledge

Brown faculty are that rare academic combination – dedicated teachers and talented researchers. From medical breakthroughs to major archaeological digs, our faculty are making front-page news.

In science, collaboration yields exciting invention, and nowhere is that more true than at Brown. Professor John Donoghue and his brain science team have pioneered a brain implant that enables paralyzed people to control computers and operate artificial limbs. Engineering Professor Robert Hurt's team has created simple packaging to absorb the toxic mercury from energy-saving fluorescent bulbs when they break or are discarded. At the Alpert Medical School, Professor Steven Moss' research team has identified two molecular markers to help physicians provide better therapies for stomach cancer.

In the humanities, our faculty's passion for discovering and disseminating knowledge enriches people's lives around the globe. Professor Forrest Gander, poet and geologist, recently won a Guggenheim Fellowship to write a book of ecologically-themed poetry. In the ancient Maya kingdom of El Zotz, Professor Stephen Houston is using an NEH grant to examine why some empires suddenly collapse. And Professor Catherine Lutz's research on U.S. military posts has made her an important global authority on why the U.S. is seeking to keep bases in Iraq.

### UNDERGRADUATE TEACHING AND RESEARCH AWARDS (UTRAs): \$50,000
